A self-governing organisation of German universities:


- 241 member universities


Reopening of DAAD Information Centre Tehran in 2014

- •DAAD president and highranking delegation of University rectors pay official visit to Iran in 2014












Language skills: German or English?

German is the language of instruction for most degree programmes at German universities.

But: Universities introduced a great number of Englishtaught programmes, aka "International Programmes".





DAAD Scholarships



- Funding for study abroad or thesis research
- No subject-related quota
- Previous knowledge of German not required, but advantageous
- Monthly stipend
- Health Insurance
- Travel reimbursement
- All-Grantees meeting in Bonn
- No scholarships for undergraduates



Funding Opportunities for Study & Research in Germany

Development-Related Postgraduate Courses (EPOS)

- In Brief
- Master's degree at a state or state-recognised German university, and in exceptional cases to take a doctoral degree, and to obtain a university qualification (Master's/PhD) in Germany

Who

- Graduates with at least two years' professional experience
- Duration
- 12 to 36 months

Value

- 750 _ 1000 €/month + additional allowances
- Deadline
- **D**epending on chosen study programme; please check scholarship brochure or the website of your chosen study programme



Paths to a PhD Individual vs. structured PhD

Individual PhD

Structured PhD

- Individual research under supervision of supervisor
- Optional courses or other forms of teaching / learning
- Mostly informal admission and marginal formalisation


- Guidance by a team of supervisors / supervising committee
- Mandatory, fixed supporting curriculum (interdisciplinary)
- Defined application process
- Offered by research training groups / graduate schools



Research in Germany



Group study visit

- Financial support for academic information visits to Germany for groups of students
- Requirements:
 - Group of 10 to 15 students plus one accompanying faculty member
 - Trip for 7 to 12 days
 - Visit should be organized entirely by the home institution
 - Application: filed by a faculty member, including total budget, a detailed itinerary, specific information about relationship to the curriculum, application form



Deadlines: November 1 (for trips between March 1 and June 1 of the following year) **February 1** (for trips between June 1 and September 1 of the same year) **May 1** (for trips no earlier than September 1 of the same year)
